On February 4, 197 students took the American Mathematics Competitions 10 exam (AMC 10) and 88 students took the AMC 12.

The top score winner on the AMC 10 was Allison Kao. Nathaniel Calabrese and Daniel Chapman-Sung had the second and third highest scores, respectively.

The top score winner on the AMC 12 was Leo Izen. Leo's score qualified him for the American Invitational Mathematics Exam (AIME) which will be administered on Thursday, March 13. This is the second time that Leo has qualified for the AIME.

Max Cassell and Mark McKinzie placed second and third, respectively, on the AMC 12.
