Did You Know?

The High School library sees approximately 350 students each day between 7:45 am and 4 pm. The size of the collection is just under 30,000 items including e-books, foreign language books, and over 4,000 reference books. The library also has 16 databases for research and study. SHHS adds about 500 new books a year. In addition to books, e-books, and reference materials, SHHS library has laptops, headsets, and calculators for student use. Mrs. Laura Daberko and Ms. Robin Sweigert are the High School librarians.


