To Whom It May Concern:

It is our pleasure to inform you about the Class of 2023's strong academic record:

- More than 48% of the Class of 2023 took at least one Advanced Placement course, and 37 students are International Baccalaureate Diploma Candidates. Additionally, at least 26% of the class took at least one dual enrollment class;
- More than 20% of the class scored 30 or higher on the ACT;
- Of those who took the SAT, 23% scored 1400 or higher in ERW + Math, and 42% scored 1300 or higher in ERW + Math;
- 3 students are designated as National Merit Semifinalists, 13 as National Merit Commended Students, 7 students recognized in the National African American Recognition Program, 1 student received the National Indigenous Award.

In addition to being outstanding scholars, these students have followed the Shaker tradition of rigorous academic programs and extensive co-curricular involvement. We do not give a numerical rank to our students and **we do not have a National Honor Society chapter at Shaker.**

One of our students is applying to your institution. We have attached his/her transcript and a Shaker Heights High School profile.

Covid-19 Statement 2022-2023: The Shaker Heights City School District moved to an asynchronous, remote learning model from March 15, 2020 through June 2020.

During the 2020-2021 school year, all students received synchronous, remote instruction during the first semester. During the second semester, students had the option to attend in-person or remain remote. District teachers utilized a hybrid synchronous schedule (teaching in-person and virtual students simultaneously), and students were held to our standard Shaker Heights High School comprehensive curriculum and grading standards.

Equity Statement 2022-2023: In order to create more equity among our student body, the Shaker Heights City School District moved to de-leveled instruction PreK-12 at the beginning of the 2020-2021 school year. The only exceptions to the de-leveling process are in AP, IB, Dual Enrollment and Advanced level courses. At Shaker Heights High School, all courses are now being taught at the Honors level.

AP, Honors, IB and Dual Enrollment courses are weighted in determining GPA. Independent study is available to students on a contractual basis. We do not calculate rank in class.

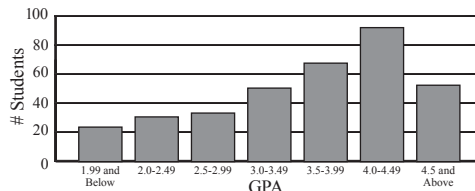

International Baccalaureate

Shaker Heights High School was authorized as an International Baccalaureate World School in 2010. The graduating class of 2022 represents the eleventh DP cohort in Shaker Heights history.

- During 2021-2022, Shaker Heights High School offered a total of 25 IB courses, many of which are taught over two years. In addition to six IB courses, all DP candidates must successfully complete the components of the Extended Essay, Theory of Knowledge, and Creativity, Activity and Service.
- In May 2022, 121 students completed 482 IB assessments in one or more of 25 subject entries.
- The average grade obtained at Shaker Heights High School by candidates who passed the diploma was 4.75. Scores of 4 and higher are considered passing.
- The average number of points obtained at Shaker Heights High School by candidates who passed the diploma was 31.
- Forty-two of 55 Diploma Candidates successfully earned the IB Diploma (75%).
