




Google Apps vs. Google for Education

Free	Free
Cloud-based	Cloud-based
Apps - Gmail, Calendar, etc.	Same apps + Classroom
Publicly available to anyone	Only available to educational institutions
No centralized administration	Centralized administration
No ability to enforce controls	Ability to enforce policies and controls
Targeted advertising	No targeted advertising





Centralized Administration

Shaker Email Policy

- K-3: no email
- 4-8: email but only within shaker.org
- 9-12: can send/receive outside shaker.org

Chromebooks in the Classroom / Library

- Carts hold 15 Chromebooks
- Quick boot up, long battery life
- Useful for instruction and hands-on practice
- Until students get their accounts later this year, they can log-on to the Chromebooks as a guest

Student Account Implementation Plan

2016-17: Timeline

- Communication with parents / permission forms
- High School accounts first (early September)
- Middle School 7th grade October 13, 8th grade October 18
- Woodbury next
- Then K-4s
- Order may change based on building readiness
- 100% of permission forms not needed to 'go live'
